GOSPEL REFLECTION: Mt 16:21-27

"If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself, take up his cross and follow me." When we hear these words of Jesus, we usually associate the carrying of the cross with some form of suffering relating to our health, our relationships, our status or this present pandemic. But Jesus is quite specific: 'If you want to be a follower of mine... 'So it's not just any old cross but it relates to discipleship of the Lord. If we are faithful to our calling in Christ, in trying to do the will of God, then that will involve the cross of renunciation, for it is a following that is realised in resistance to the prevailing ethos. "Do not model yourself on the behaviour of the world around you," St Paul says in the second reading today. We can easily empty the cross of its power and significance by calling everything we suffer 'carrying the cross.' The common vexations of life which visit everyone may be means of grace and growth depending on our response. But to take up the cross demands more than this. It means a readiness to take a stand and suffer the consequences of our choice for the Lord. The doctor who loses promotion because of his prolife position; the employee who is frozen out because he will not be party to underhand practices; the young person who is ridiculed because he or she attends Mass or wants to live a chaste life; the couple who are misunderstood as they try to live by Church teaching on marriage and family. The cross is costly. It is counter-cultural. When we take up the cross of fidelity to the gospel we walk a difficult road. Sometimes feeling alone, laughed at, scared. The paradox is that when we, however feebly, take up the cross, when we die to self-centeredness or self-preservation, then we experience that peace which the world cannot give. When we persevere in faith we become true disciples of the Lord. The cross always leads to life, as it did for Christ, and he is with us all along the way helping us carry our cross which he makes light for us. Let us walk together, looking out for each other, as we draw towards the eternal day.
