REFLECTION

We are, by nature, social and celebratory beings. We like and need to come together, to be in each other's company. 'It is not good for man to be alone.' (Gen. 2:18). We also, instinctively, like to celebrate whenever some event occurs in our lives; birthdays, weddings, anniversaries etc. Some celebrations can be rather lively like my recent noisy affair (great fun! happy feet!), others more quiet and sedate. Whatever way we choose, that desire to celebrate tells us something about ourselves and which sets us apart from the animal world. Animals are indeed sociable but I don't think they are party-goers! That is something distinctive about humans, the desire to celebrate. It's God-given. It's what we shall be doing for the rest of eternity. We are destined for the eternal celebration of heaven, where we shall dance with angels before the awesome beauty of God who is, himself, a social being, a community of love, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We are made in his image and likeness (Gen. 1:26), and we reflect this when we form a community and we want to celebrate the joy of being together. This defines us and is natural to us. When we gather together for Mass we call it a celebration because we rejoice in Christ's company, who is the unifying principle of our worship. 'Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I say rejoice!' (Phil. 4:4). Unlike earthly celebrations which naturally come to an end and we, perhaps feel a little deflated, the heavenly celebrations which await us never end, nor shall we tire. Hard to imagine, but that's because we live in the limitations of this world. A new existence awaits us where the vision of God, the source of our life and our joy, will never fail, will never be exhausted. So every time we have a celebration it is, in a way, a foretaste of the celebratory life of heaven.
