

There will be a second collection for the Society for the Protection of Unborn Children next Sunday at all Masses. This year's appeal calls for the Government to end the pills-by-post DIY abortion policy. As well as ending the lives of precious babies, this policy lacks safeguards against illegal late-term abortions and puts mothers at physical and psychological risk. 86% of GPs are concerned that this scheme leaves women vulnerable to coerced abortion. #### **REFLECTION**

The devil loves no more than to keep us in a state of sadness and joylessness. That's his great weapon! Ignore him and come to Jesus and seek his protection and healing. A smile will return to your lips and the dead cold of winter will lift from our hearts. Springtime will enter in and we will come back to life. Let sad turn to glad. All it takes is a few moments each day in the presence of the divine physician. No appointment needed! Just turn up.
